The program was initiated by Lazismu Kota Medan to build the spirit of the young generation of Muslims at the Muhammadiyah University of North Sumatra, especially the Faculty of Islam. As for the youth philanthropy program, which is carried out by providing a tin-shaped piggy bank provided by Lazismu Kota Medan to spark the enthusiasm of students to share at any time by setting aside the money to share with others. Once a month Lazismu Medan City officers will quote any savings or piggy bank that has been provided.

The fundraising that will be carried out will later be distributed to members of the community who need it will also be allocated for scholarships for underprivileged students, provided that 70% of the results obtained will be used to support the youth education program at FAI UMSU. And 30% will be used by Lazismu Medan City to support various philatropic

programs at the institution. Seeing this phenomenon, it is very appropriate for Islamic universities to become a forum in building the spirit of philanthropy for the younger generation of Islam.
