This novel tells about a young girl named Kya who is growing up in the marsh but she could adapt. Delia Owens wants to write a novel by a nature writing who spent as much time as she can in the wilderness. Like Owens stated in Reese's Book Club:

"I longed to write a novel immersed in nature writing which would examine how our behavior today is influenced by ancient genes. I wanted to write a mystery that didn't just ask the question who done it, but why the culprit behaved as they did. To explore human nature with nature writing." (Owens, 2018).

The researchers are very interested to the main character and this novel is beautifully written, contains poetry and vivid description of the Marsh. Kya's journey spans years, the reader present from her childhood into maturity. This story deals to wilderness and Mother Earth with all of her glorious wonder, her instinctual need to nurture and protect. Based on this story, the s would like to explore deeper on the matter of the main character's struggle in *Where the Crawdads Sing*.

The title of the novel, Where the Crawdads Sing is taken from a phrase Owens' mother used to encouraging her tomboy daughter to take the woods around their rural Georgia home and listen to what those woods had to say. Owens stated in CBS News, I learned from a book that crawdads don't really sing. But I learned from my mother that if you go far enough into the wilderness by yourself, and there's nothing but you and nature, you will hear the crawdads sing (CBS News, 2019).

Every youngster in a family wants to be loved and protected by their own family, as we all know. However, there is a female in this novel who is having the opposite experience. Where the Crawdads Sing tells about a story of struggle, of what depth of loneliness feels like when a young girl named Kya is abandoned first by her mother, then her four siblings. They leaves from their father's meanness, his abuse and his drinking. They leaves her behind with her father but she remains alone since her father comes and goes until he does not come back. Heartbreaking how she is neglected and abandoned, tries to figure out a way to eat. She has been abandoned by her parents, siblings, school system, and the entire town surrounding her and what ultimately feels like life itself. She has to survive for years alone in a marsh that she calls home. This story reflects the struggle of the main character in Owens' Where the Crawdads Sing.

RESEARCH METHODOLGY

This study is qualitative research, That means the data is deal with word and quotation as opposed to number, figures or calculation. According to Bogdan and Biklen:

"Qualitative research is descriptive. The data collected are in form of words or picture rather than numbers. The written result of the research contains quotations from data to illustrate and substantiate the presentation" (1992:30).

"Ma had always said the autumn moon showed up for her brithday So even though she couldn't remember the date of her birth, one evening when the moon rose swollen and golden from the lagoon, Kya said to herself, I reckon I'm seven. Pa never mentioned it; certainly there was no cake. He didn't say anything about her going to school either, and she, not knowing much about it, was too afraid to bring it up". (Owens, 2019:56).

The quotation above shows when Autum Moon reminders Ma of her birthday, but she doesn't remember the exact date, and Pa never mentioned it either. She was supposed to guess her own age. There was no cake or birthday celebration, as it customary on one's birthday. That's the reality not everyone has a prefect life, there are some things that must be accepted in this life. It is seen in the following quotation:

'The teacher walked back to the front and said, Catherine, please stand and tell the class your full name. Her stomach churned. Come now, dear, don't be shy. Kya stood. Miss Catherine Danielle Clark, she said, because that was what Ma once said was her whole name. Can you spell dog for us? Staring at the floor, Kya stood silent. Jodie and Ma had taught her some letters. But she'd never spelled a word aloud for anybody. Nerves stirred in her stomach; still, she tried. G-o-d. Laughter let loose up and down the rows". (Owens, 2019:34).

The quotation above describes she was humiliated when she started her first school and her teacher asked her to stand up and introduce her self in front of the class. The teacher asked her to spell a word, but she was nervous and the classroom laughed at her. The reality not always perfect and smooth, It seen in the following quotation:

"Kya couldn't remember how to pray. Was it how you held your hands or how hard you squinted your eyes that mattered? Maybe if I pray, Ma and Jodie will come home. Even with all the shouting

and fussing, that life was better than this lumpy-grits" (Owens, 2019:76).

The quotation above depicts that she tried to prayer but couldn't remember the way, She hoped Jodie and ma would comeback and see her again, But after all that she realized whatever she did, it wouldn't happen, the truth of she was abandoned of her entire family, However she had to survive without anybody in her life. In this life none wont to be abandoned by whole family. It seen in the following quotation:

"I guess some things can't be explained, only forgiven or not. I don't know the answer. Maybe there isn't one. I'm sorry to bring you this bad news. I've had no family, no news of family for most of my life. Now within a few minutes I've found a brother and lost my mother. I'm so sorry, Kya. Don't be. Actually, I lost Ma years ago, and now you're back, Jodie. I can't tell you how much I wanted to see you again. This is one of the happiest and yet saddest days of my life. She touched his arm with her fingers, and he already knew her enough to know this was rare". (Owens, 2019:197).

The quotation above explains that she feelings happy and sad at the same time, because Jodie came to see her after a long time and told her that Ma had died. But she had actually lost ma years before. Living alone in Marsh with no news of her entire family.

It is seen in the following quotation: "Slowly, she unraveled each word of the sentence there are some who can live without wild things, and some who cannot. Oh, she said. Oh. You can read, Kya. There will never be a time again when you can't read. It ain't just that. She spoke almost in a whisper I wadn't aware that words could hold so much. I didn't know a sentence could be so full. He smiled. That's a very good sentence. Not all words hold that much" (Owens, 2019:67).

But you talked to me about marriage, remember? You talked about building a house for you and me. Instead I found out about your engagement to somebody else in the newspaper. Why'd you do that? The quotation above shows the quarrel of the both, she was betrayed by Chase the man she trusted. A broken promise to marriage her stayed forever. The fact that he was engaged to another woman made her so upset and never wanted to see him again. The consequences of loving were reality to get hurt, but it shows that it wasn't the one.

"He was her first love, but he had dropped her when he went to college, left her waiting on the lagoon shore. So it had ended. How long ago was Jodie asked. About seven years, I guess.
