As well as the usual academic facilities such as classrooms, halls, libraries and laboratories, boarding schools often provide a wide variety of facilities for extracurricular activities such as music rooms, gymnasiums, sports fields and school grounds, boats, squash courts, swimming pools, cinemas and theatres. A school chapel is often found on site. Day students often stay on after school to use these facilities.

Elements of Boarding School

Almost certainly, the birth of a Boarding School began with some basic elements that were always therein. There are five Boarding School elements between one and the other that cannot be separated. These three elements include kyai, santri, house, mosque, and teaching classical Islamic books, or what is often referred to as the yellow book:³

1. Kyai

Kyai or caregiver boarding school is a very essential element for a boarding school. The average Boarding School that develops in Java and Madura are very influential, charismatic and authoritative, so highly respected by the community in the community. The term kyai is usually commonly used in Central Java and East Java alone. While in West Java the term "Ajengan" is used, in Aceh with tengku, while in North Sumatra it is called Buya.

2. Cottage

The boarding school or residence of students, is a characteristic of the Boarding School tradition that distinguishes it from other education systems that develop in most Islamic regions of other countries.

3. Mosque

A cleric who wants to develop Boarding School, in general the first priority is the mosque. The mosque is considered as an inseparable symbol of the Boarding School. The mosque is not only a ritual practice of worship, but also a place of teaching the yellow books.

4. Santri

Santri are students or students who study in Boarding School. A scholar can be called a kyai if he has a Boarding School and santri living in the Boarding School to study Islamic religious sciences through the yellow books. Therefore, existence usually also related to the presence of students in their Boarding School.

5. Teach the Yellow Book

Based on historical records, the Boarding School has taught classical books, especially the Sayfiiyyah schools. the teaching of Arabic and non-holk yellow books or often called Gundul books is the only method that is formally taught in the Boarding School community in Indonesia. There are several types of Islamic boarding schools, for example, pondok Boarding School salaf, khalaf, modern, and takhasus Al-Qur'an.

Boarding School Education System

The education system according to Mastuhu (1995: 234) is the totality of interactions of a set of educational elements that work together in an integrated, and mutual way complement each other towards the achievement of educational goals which have become the common goal of the perpetrators. Collaboration between these actors is based on, imbued with, motivated, stimulated, and directed by the noble values that are held in high esteem by them. The elements of an educational system in addition to consisting of actors who are organic elements, also consist of other inorganic elements, in the form of funds, facilities and other educational tools, both hardware and software. The relationship between values and elements in an education system is an inseparable unit from the other.

The basic elements of education are: (1) education: Islam, because Islam is the only true and perfect religion that can save the world and in the hereafter. Because the boarding school education system is part (sub system) alone from Islamic education, the principle is Islam; (2) goals: the ultimate goal (ultimate goal), is the ultimate goal of every Muslim's goal, namely achieving God's blessing, and the general goal (institutional) is the same as the goal of the creation of mankind in this world, that is, serving God, and the special purpose (curricular) is according to function the establishment of an Islamic boarding school educational institution functions to produce prospective scholars and religious experts; Students are the subject of scholars and clerics.

The clerics function as the servants of the scholars, must have the characteristics as the scholars, so that in the hut the Boarding School is manifested as a complete leadership; student objects in Islamic boarding schools are the students, the most dominant and dominant education material in Islamic boarding schools are the Islamic religious sciences; educational methods at Islamic boarding schools: the uswah method hasanah, dialogue (question and answer), weton, sorogan / bandongan, muhawarah, mudzakarah; tool education, and time.

The Boarding School education system also consists of elements and values unity. The quality of the dynamics of a Boarding School education system is very dependent on the quality of caregivers and the weight of interaction between elements and principals who are there is. Basically every educational institution always wants quality and the quantity goes hand in hand and in balance, so that it doesn't experience that problem crucial To avoid this, Boarding School readiness is needed.
